

Africa ... a land of opportunity & challenge

- 54 countries
- 1,000+ languages
- 1 billion people
- 3,000 distinct ethnic groups
- 23 elections in 2013
- \$3,539.75 per capita GDP \$59
 to \$16,507)
- Poor transport and logistics
- Inefficient administrative/regulatory control
- Poor access to highly skilled labour
- Poor utilities and energy security
- 5.5 6% GDP







SOME FACTS ABOUT AIR TRANSPORT IN AFRICA

- Air transport supports 6.7 million jobs and \$67.8 billion in GDP in Africa.
- According to the Oxford Economic study on the benefits of aviation in Africa, there are:
 - 762,000 flights
 - 371 commercial airports
 - 256 airlines
 - 1,302 aircraft in service
- Worldwide, Africa represents 12% of the total jobs
 and 3% of the GDP generated by the air transport industry.







AVIATION DEVELOPMENT AND CHALLENGES

- African air transport has increased by 6.6%, making it the most rapid growth region after the Middle East.
- However, the absolute traffic figures remain relatively very low because of the small base. For instance in 2015, Africa accounted for only 2% of the global traffic.
- Africa's GDP is expected to grow at the rate of 4.5%, compared with the world average rate of 3.7%,
- Africa's potential is undeniable, but to realise the full potential there are many challenges:

Poor record of safety and security


Lack of adequate resources and infrastructure

Lack of regulation and government actions




AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY

PARTNERSHIP WITH IATA AND THE PARTICPATING STATES




