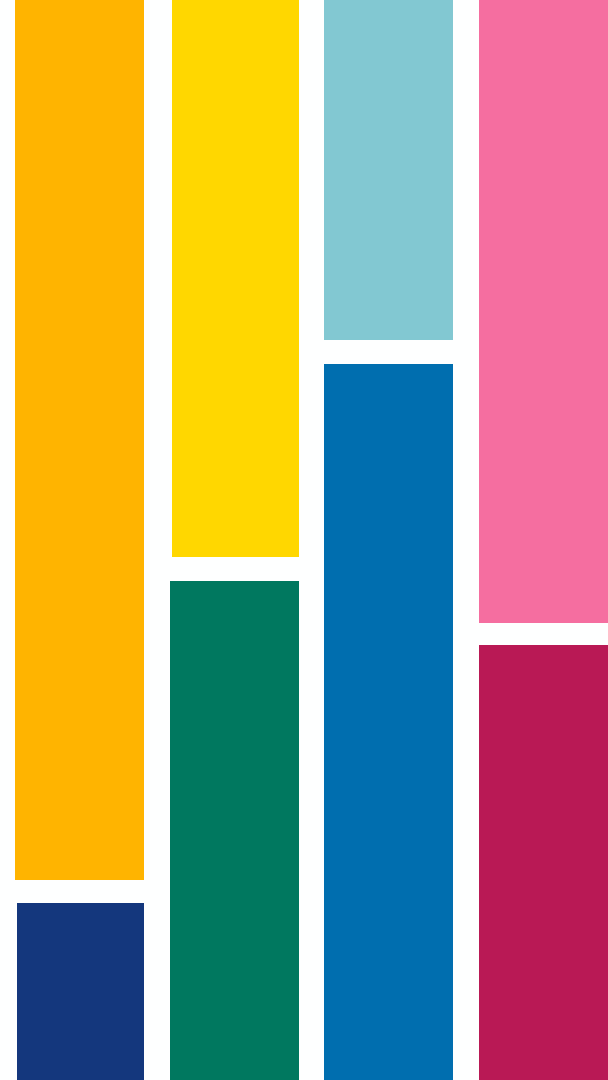

Who are the main stakeholders that should be involved in an urban node?

Some established definitions from the SUMP domain

(Key) stakeholders

- *‘Individuals and organisations that hold **political, regulatory, functional** or **financial** powers as well as responsible competencies’*
- *‘Organisations, communities and individuals **that will ultimately be affected** - positively or negatively – by new transport measures’*

Roles (RASCI model):

Responsible – Accountable – Supporting – Consulted - Informed

Forms of cooperation

- Vertical: between different levels of governance
- Horizontal: between local administrations, private sector, operators, neighbouring municipalities, NGOs, ...
- Spatial: across different geographical areas and administrative boundaries
- Inter-sectoral: different backgrounds, knowledge and fields of expertise

Spatial

- Local administration leading on SUMP development + political representatives
- Neighbouring municipalities
- Regional entities
- Attraction poles / business districts beyond administrative boundaries
- Port/Airport authorities
