In cooperation with the École Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL) and Istanbul Technical University, FSR Transport publishes the 'Network Industries Quarterly' (NIQ). The NIQ aims to: cover research findings regarding the most compelling challenges deriving from liberalisation that affected network industries in the recent past; monitor emerging trends, and analyse their strategic implications on regulation, risk management, governance and innovation across the different regulated sectors. FSR Transport also collaborates with the Innovative Governance of Large Urban Systems (IGLUS) Programme to publish the IGLUS Quarterly, which aims to facilitate knowledge and experience sharing among scholars and practitioners on urban systems performance in terms of service efficiency, sustainability and resilience.
